SHOULD DO = A GOOD THNG TO DO

❖ You should do something = it is a good thing to do or the right thing to do.

You can use should to give advice or to give an opinion:

- EX1: You look tired. You should go to bed.
- EX2: The government should do more to improve schools.
- EX3: A: Should we invite Stephanie to the party?
 B: Yes, I think we should.
- EX4: The man on the motorbike should be wearing a helmet.
- You shouldn't do something = it isn't a good thing to do:
 - EX5: You shouldn't believe everything you read in newspapers.

- We often use should with I think / I don't think / Do you think ... ?:
 - EX6: I think the government should do more to improve schools.
 - EX7: I don't think you **should** work so hard.
 - EX8: A: Do you think I should apply for this job?
 - b: Yes, I think you should.
- Should is not as strong as must or have to:
 - EX9: You should apologize. (= it would be a good thing to do)
 - EX10: You must apologize. / You have to apologize.
 (= you have no alternative)

SHOULD DO / SHOULD HAVE DONE

- We use should when something is not right or what we expect:
 - EX11: Where's Tina? She should be here by now.
 (= she isn't here yet, and this is not normal)
 - EX12: The price on this packet is wrong. It should be £2.50, not £3.50.
- We also use should to say that we expect something to happen:
 - EX13: Helen has been studying hard for the exam, so she should pass. (= I expect her to pass)
 - EX14: There are plenty of hotels in the town. It shouldn't be hard to find a place to stay.
 (= I don't expect it to be hard)

- You **should have done** something = you didn't do it, but it would have been a good thing to do:
 - EX15: You missed a great party last night. You
 should have come. Why didn't you?
 (= you didn't come, but it would have been good to come)
 - EX16: I wonder why they're so late. They should have been here long ago.
- You shouldn't have done something = you did it, but it wasn't a good thing to do:
 - EX17: I'm feeling sick. I shouldn't have eaten so much. (= I ate too much)
 - EX18: She shouldn't have been listening to our conversation. It was private. (= she was listening)
- Compare should (do) and should have (done):
 - EX19: You look tired. You should go to bed now.
 - EX20: You went to bed very late last night. You should have gone to bed earlier.



OUGHT TO

ought to ...

- * You can use ought to instead of should in the sentences on this page.
 - We say "ought to do" (with to):
 - EX21: Do you think I ought to apply for this job? (= Do you think I should apply ...?)
 - EX22: Jack ought not to go to bed so late. (= Jack shouldn't go ...)
 - EX23: It was a great party last night. You ought to have come. (= You should have come)

- 1. Should nghĩa là nên làm một việc gì đó; Còn "shouldn't do something" có nghĩa "không nên làm" một việc gì đó You look tired. You should go to bed.
- 2. Ta thường dùng should trong các tình huống sau:
 - Một việc gì đó không ổn, không giống như ta mong đợi Where's Tina? She should be here by now.
 - Diễn tả chúng ta mong đợi một việc gì đó Helen has been studying hard for the exam, so she should pass.
- **3. "Should have done"** được dùng trong tình huống chủ ngữ đã không làm một việc gì đó trong quá khứ mà anh ta nên làm vào thời điểm đó You missed a great party last night. You should have come. Why didn't you?
- 4. "Shouldn't have done" được dùng trong tình huống chủ ngữ đã làm một việc gì đó trong quá khứ mà anh ta không nên làm vào thời điểm đó I'm feeling sick. I shouldn't have eaten so mụch.
