

BOTH / NEITHER / EITHER

We use both/neither/either for two things.

You can use these words with a noun (both books, neither book etc.). For example, you are going out to eat. There are two possible restaurants. You say:

- EX1: Both restaurants are good. (not the both restaurants)
- EX2: Neither restaurant is expensive.
- EX3: We can go to either restaurant. I don't mind. (= one or the other, it doesn't matter which)
- EX4: I haven't been to either restaurant before. (= not one or the other)
- **❖** You can also use both/neither/either without a noun:
 - EX5: 'Which do you prefer, basketball or tennis?' 'It's hard to say. I like both.'
 - EX6: 'Is your friend British or American?' 'Neither. She's Australian.'
 - EX7: 'Do you want tea or coffee?' 'Either. I don't mind.'

BOTH OF / NEITHER OF / EITHER OF

- We use both of / neither of / either of + the/these/my/Tom's ... etc. So we say 'both of the restaurants', 'both of those restaurants' etc. (but not both of restaurants):
 - EX8: Both of these restaurants are good.
 - EX9: Neither of the restaurants we went to was expensive.
 - EX10: I haven't been to either of those restaurants.
- **❖** You don't need of after both. So you can say:
 - EX11: Both of these restaurants are good. or Both these restaurants are good.
- ❖ We also use both of / neither of / either of + us/you/them:
 - EX12: (talking to two people) Can either of you speak Russian?
 - EX13: I asked two people how to get to the station, but neither of them knew.
- * We say 'both of' before us/you/them (you need to use of):
 - EX14: Both of us were tired. (not Both us were ...)
- **❖** After neither of ... a verb can be singular or plural:
 - EX15: Neither of them is at home. or Neither of them are at home.

BOTH ... AND ... / NEITHER ... NOR. ... / EITHER ... OR ...

both ... and ... EX16: Both Chris and Paul were late.

EX17: I was both tired and hungry when I arrived home.

neither ... nor ... EX18: Neither Chris nor Paul came to the party.

EX19: There was an accident outside our house, but we neither saw nor heard anything.

either ... or ... EX20: I'm not sure where Maria's from. She's either Spanish or Italian.

EX21: Either you apologise, or I'll never speak to you again.

EITHER, NEITHER, BOTH V.S ANY, NONE, ALL

Compare either/neither/both (two things) and any/none/all (more than two):

EX22A: There are two good hotels here. EX22B: There are many good hotels here.

EX23A: You could stay at either of them.
EX23B: You could stay at any of them.

EX24A: We tried two hotels.
EX24B: We tried a lot of hotels.

EX25A: Neither of them had a room. EX25B: None of them had a room.

EX26A: Both of them were full.

EX26B: All of them were full.

TÓM TẮT

- 1. Chúng ta có thể dùng các từ chỉ định (determiner) both/neither/either với một cặp (2) danh từ. Both books, neither books, either books v.v... Khi ngữ cảnh đã xác định được danh từ chúng ta đang nói đến, chúng ta có thể lược bỏ danh từ, và chỉ cần dùng both, neither, either. "Which do you prefer, basketball or tennis?" "It's hard to say. I like both. "
- 2. Chúng ta cũng có thể dùng **both of ..., neither of ..., either of ... + danh từ xác định** (the + danh từ hoặc từ xác định + danh từ) hoặc một đại từ túc từ. Neither of the restaurants we went to was expensive. Both of us were tired. Riêng với **both**, chúng ta không cần thêm "**of"** (nghĩa là thêm cũng không sao). **Both these** restaurants are good.
- 3. Sau neither of ..., động từ có thể là số ít hoặc số nhiều.
- 4. Chúng ta có thể dùng **both .. and / neither ... nor ... / either ... or ...** trong các cụm danh từ làm chủ ngữ hoặc túc từ trong câu. **Neither** Chris **nor** Paul came to the party.
