I DON'T – HE DOESN'T

Ex7: I don't like football.

Ex8: He doesn't like football.

Ex9: I don't like Fred and Fred doesn't like me. (not Fred don't like)

Ex10: My car doesn't use much petrol. (not My car don't use)

Ex11: Sometimes he is late, but it doesn't happen very often.



DON'T DO / DOESN'T DO

We use don't/doesn't + infinitive (don't like / doesn't speak / doesn't do etc.)

- Ex12: I don't like washing the car. I don't do it very often.
- Ex13: Sarah speaks Spanish, but she doesn't speak Italian. (not doesn't speaks)
- Ex14: David doesn't do his job very well. (not David doesn't his job)
- Ex15: Paula doesn't usually have breakfast, (not doesn't... has)
