Sarah goes to work every day. She is always there from 8.30 until 4.30.

- It is 11 o'clock now. Sarah is at work.
- At 11 o'clock yesterday, she was at work.
- At 11 o'clock tomorrow, she will be at work.

will + infinitive (will be / will win / will come etc.):

- "II = will: I'll (I will)/you'll/she'll etc.
- won't = will not: I won't (= I will not) / you won't / she won't etc.

Will / Shall 1



WILL

В

- We use will for the future (tomorrow / next week etc.):
 - Ex1: Sue travels a lot. Today she is in Madrid. Tomorrow she'll be in Rome.
 Next week she'll be in Tokyo.
 - Ex2: You can call me this evening. I'll be at home.
 - Ex3: Leave the old bread in the garden. The birds will eat it.
 - Ex4: We'll probably go out this evening.
 - Ex5: Will you be at home this evening?
 - Ex6: I won't be here tomorrow. (= I will not be here)
 - Ex7: Don't drink coffee before you go to bed. You won't sleep.
- We often say I think ... will ...
 - Ex8: I think Kelly will pass the exam.
 - Ex9: I don't think it will rain this afternoon.
 - Ex10: Do you think the exam will be difficult?

Will / Shall 1



WILL OR BE GOING TO OR PRESENT CONTINUOUS

C

- ❖ We do not use will for things we have already arranged or decided to do
 (→Units 25-26):
 - Ex11: We're going to the cinema on Saturday. Do you want to come with us? (not We will go)
 - Ex12: I'm not working tomorrow. (not I won't work)
 - Ex13: Are you going to do the exam? (not Will you do)

Will / Shall 1



SHALL

D

- *You can say I shall (= I will) and we shall (= we will):
 - EX14: I shall be late tomorrow, or I will (I'll) be late tomorrow.
 - EX15: I think we shall win. or I think we will (we'll) win
- * But do not use shall with you/they/he/she/it:
 - EX16: Tom will be late. (not Tom shall be)
