WILL DIỄN TẢ ĐỀ NGHỊ HOẶC QUYẾT ĐỊNH



- You can use I'll... (I will) when you offer something or decide to do something:
 - Ex1: 'My bag is very heavy.' I'll carry it for you.'
 - Ex2: I'll phone you tomorrow, OK?' 'OK, bye.'

- We often say I think I'll... I don't think I'll... when we decide to do something:
 - Ex3: I'm tired. I think I'll go to bed early tonight.
 - Ex4: It's a nice day. I think I'll sit outside.
 - Ex5: It's raining. I don't think I'll go out.

- Do not use the present simple (I go / I phone etc.) in sentences like these:
 - Ex6: I'll phone you tomorrow, OK? (not I phone you)
 - Ex7: I think I'll go to bed early. (not I go to bed)

WILL OR BE GOING TO

- Do NOT use I'll ... for something you decided before (Units 25-26):
 - Ex8: I'm working tomorrow. (not I'll work)
 - Ex9: I don't want my car any more. I'm going to sell it. (not I'll sell)
 - Ex10: What are you doing at the weekend? (not What will you do)

WILL OR BE GOING TO OR PRESENT CONTINUOUS

Shall I / Shall we ...? = Do you think this is a good thing to do? Do you think this is a good idea?

- Ex11: It's very warm in this room. Shall I open the window?
- Ex12: 'Shall I phone you this evening?' 'Yes, please.'
- Ex13: I'm going to a party tonight. What shall I wear?
- Ex14: It's a nice day. Shall we go for a walk?
- Ex15: Where shall we go for our holidays this year?
- Ex16: 'Let's go out this evening.' 'OK, what time shall we meet?'
