A



should + infinitive (should do / should watch etc.):

I/We/You/They
He/She/It

should shouldn't do
stop
go
watch etc.



B

CÁCH DÙNG

- *You should do something = it is a good thing to do, it is the right thing to do
 - EX1: Tom doesn't study enough. He should study harder.
 - EX2: It's a good film. You should go and see it.
 - EX3: When you play tennis, you should always watch the ball.
- **❖** You shouldn't do something = it is not a good thing to do.

Shouldn't = should not

- EX4: Tom shouldn't go to bed so late.
- EX5: You watch TV all the time. You shouldn't watch TV so much.



I THINK I SHOULD

C

- **❖** We often say I think ... should
 - Ex6: I think Lisa should buy some new clothes.
 (= I think it is a good idea.)
 - Ex7: It's late. I think I should go home now.
 - Ex8: A: Shall I buy this coat?
 B: Yes, I think you should.
- I don't think ... should ...
 - Ex9: I don't think you should work so hard.
 (= I don't think it is a good idea.)
 - Ex10: I don't think we should go yet. It's too early.
- Do you think ... should ... ?:
 - Ex11: Do you think I should buy this hat?
 - Ex12: What time do you think we should go home?





MUST V.S SHOULD

D

Must is stronger than should:

- EX13: It's a good film. You should go and see it.
- EX14: It's a fantastic film. You must go and see it.

E

SHOULD ~ OUGHT TO

EX15: It's a good film. You ought to go and see it.

(= you should go)

EX16: I think Lisa ought to buy some new clothes.

(= Lisa should buy)
