


You can say I used to work ... / she used to have ... / they used to be ... etc.:

- Ex3: Lisa has got short hair now, but it used to be very long.
- Ex4: They used to live in the same street as us, so we used to see them a lot. But we don't see them much these days.
- Ex5: Helen used to have a piano, but she sold it a few years ago.
- The negative is I didn't use to ...
  - Ex6: When I was a child, I didn't use to like tomatoes.

We use **used to** ... only for **the past**. You **cannot** say 'I use to ...' for **the present**:

- Ex8: I used to play tennis. These days I play golf. (not I use to play golf)
- Ex9: We usually get up early. (not We use to get up early)
