THERE WAS / THERE WERE (PAST)



There is a train every hour.

The time now is 11.15.

There was a train at 11 o'clock.

There is/are (present)

- Ex1A: There is nothing on TV tonight.
- Ex2A: We are staying at a very big hotel. There are 550 rooms.
- Ex3A: Is everything OK? Are there any problems.
- Ex4A: I'm hungry, but there isn't anything to eat.

There was/were (past)

- Ex1B: There was nothing on TV last night.
- Ex2B: We stayed at a very big hotel. There were 550 rooms
- Ex3B: Was everything OK yesterday?


 Were there any problems?
- Ex4B: I was hungry when I got home, but there wasn't anything to eat

There was/were - There has/have been - There will be

THERE HAS BEEN / THERE HAVE BEEN (PRESENT PERFECT)



- Ex5: Look! There's been an accident. (there's been = there has been)
- Ex6: This road is very dangerous. There have been many accidents.

Compare there was (past):

Ex7: There was an accident last night.
 (not There has been an accident last night.)

For past simple and present perfect, see Unit 20.

There was/were - There has/have been - There will be

THERE WILL BE



- Ex8: Do you think **there will** be a lot of people at the party on Saturday?
- Ex9: The manager of the company is leaving, so
 there will be a new manager soon.
- Ex10: I'm going away tomorrow. I'll do my packing today because there won't be time tomorrow.
 (there won't be = there will not be)
