CÁCH DIỄN TẢ SỰ QUAN TÂM HOẶC NGẠC NHIÊN



- ❖ You can say **have you?** / **is it?** / **can't he?** etc. to show that you are interested or surprised:
 - Ex1: 'You're late.' 'Oh, **am I?** I'm sorry.'
 - Ex2: 'I was ill last week.' 'Were you? I didn't know that.'
 - Ex3: 'It's raining again.' 'Is it? It was sunny ten minutes ago.'
 - Ex4: 'There's a problem with the car.' 'Is there? What's wrong with it?'
 - Ex5: 'Bill can't drive.' 'Can't he? I didn't know that.'
 - Ex6: 'I'm not hungry.' 'Aren't you? I am.'
 - Ex7: 'Sue isn't at work today.' 'Isn't she? Is she ill?'
- ❖ Use **do/does** for the present simple, and **did** for the past simple:
 - Ex8: 'I speak four languages.' 'Do you? Which ones?'
 - Ex9: 'Ben doesn't eat meat.' 'Doesn't he? Does he eat fish?'
 - Ex10: 'Nicola got married last week.' 'Did she? Really?'

Have you? Are you? Don't you? etc...

CÁCH DÙNG CÂU HỎI ĐUÔI

You can use **have you?** / **is it?** / **can't she?** etc. at the end of a sentence.

These 'mini-questions' are *question tags*.



Positive sentence -> negative question tag

- Ex11: **Kate lives** in London, doesn't she?
- Ex12: **You closed** the window, didn't you,
- Ex13: **Those shoes are** nice, aren't they?
- Ex14: **Tom will be** here soon, won't he?

Yes, that's right.
Yes, I think so.
Yes, very nice.
Yes, probably.

Have you? Are you? Don't you? etc...



B

CÁCH DÙNG CÂU HỎI ĐUÔI

Negative sentence -> positive question tag

- Ex15: **That isn't** your car, **is it?**
- Ex16: **You haven't** met my mother, **have you?**
- Ex17: **Helen doesn't** go out much, **does she?**
- Ex18: **You won't** be late, **will you?**

No, it's my mother's.
No, I haven't.
No, she doesn't.
No, I'm never late.
