Who is she talking to? What is it like (question 3)

A CÂU HỎI VỚI CÁC TỪ 'ĐỂ HỎI VÀ GIỚI TỪ'



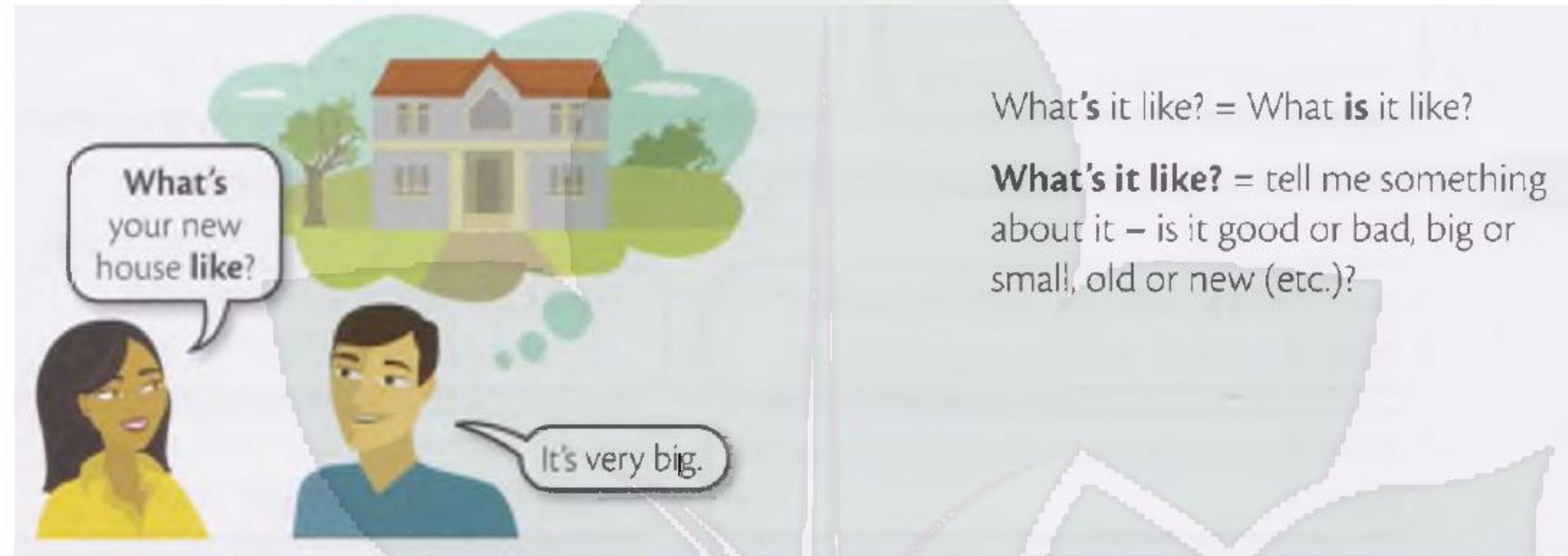
Jessica is talking to somebody.
Who is she talking **to**?

In questions beginning **Who ... / What ... ? / Where ... ? / Which ... ?**, prepositions (**to/from/with** etc.) usually go at the end:

- Ex1: 'Where are you **from**?' 'I'm from Thailand.'
- Ex2: 'Jack was afraid.' '**What** was he afraid **of**?'
- Ex3: '**Who** do these books belong **to**?' 'They're mine.'
- Ex4: 'Tom's father is in hospital.' '**Which** hospital is he **in**?'
- Ex5: 'Kate is going on holiday.' '**Who with**?' / '**Who** is she going **with**?'
- Ex6: 'Can we talk?' 'Sure. **What** do you want to talk **about**?'

Who is she talking to? What is it like (question 3)

B CÁCH DÙNG CÂU HỎI "WHAT IS IT LIKE?"



When we say 'What is it like?' **like** is a **preposition**. It is not the verb like ('Do you like your new house?' etc.).

- Ex7: A: There's a new restaurant in our street.
B: **What's it like?** Is it good?
A: I don't know. I haven't eaten there yet.
- Ex8: A: **What's** your new teacher **like**?
B: She's very good. We learn a lot.
- Ex9: A: I met Nicola's parents yesterday.
B: Did you? **What** are they **like**?
A: They're very nice.
- Ex10: A: Did you have a good holiday? **What** was the weather **like**?
B: It was lovely. It was sunny every day.
