GO TO...

go to ... (go to work / go to London / go to a concert etc.)

- Ex1: What time do you usually go to work?
- Ex2: I'm going to China next week.
- Ex3: Sophie didn't want to go to the concert
- Ex4: 'Where's Tom?' 'He's gone to bed.'
- Ex5: I went to the dentist yesterday.

go to sleep = start to sleep:

Ex6: I was very tired and went to sleep quickly.

go home (without to)

Ex7: I'm going home now. (not going to home)

GO ON...

goon	holiday a trip a tour a cruise
	strike

- Ex8: We're going on holiday next week.
- Ex9: Children often go on school trips.
- Ex10: Workers at the airport have gone on strike.

(= they are refusing to work)

go to.../go on.../go for.../go +-ing

GO FOR...

	a walk
	a run
go (somewhere) for	a swim
	a drink
	a meal

- Ex11: 'Where's Emma?' 'She's gone for a walk.'
- Ex12: Do you go for a run every morning?
- Ex13: The water looks nice. I'm going for a swim.
- Ex14: I met Chris in town, so we went for coffee.
- Ex15: Shall we go out for a meal? I know a good restaurant.

go to.../go on.../go for.../go +-ing

GO + -ING

We use go + -ing for many sports (swimming / skiing etc.) and also shopping.

shopping swimming go fishing sailing skiing jogging etc.

- Ex16: Are you going shopping this afternoon?
- Ex17: It's a nice day. Let's **go swimming**. (or Let's **go for** a swim.)
- Ex18: Richard has a small boat and he often goes sailing.
- Ex19: I went jogging before breakfast this morning.
