Get



"GET" ĐI VỚI DANH TỪ

get + noun = receive, buy, find etc



you get it



you have it

- you don't have something
- Ex1: I got an email from Sam this morning. (= receive)
- Ex2: I like your sweater. Where did you get it? (= buy)
- Ex3: It's hard to get a job at the moment. (= find)
- Ex4: 'Is Lisa here?' 'Yes, I'll get her for you.'

also get a bus / a train / a taxi (= take a bus/train etc.):

Ex5: 'Did you walk here?' 'No, I got the bus.'



B "GET" ĐI VỚI TÍNH TỪ

get hungry / get cold / get tired etc (get +adjective) = become

you get hungry

you are hungry

- you're not hungry
- Ex6: If you don't eat, you get hungry.
- Ex7: Drink your coffee. It's getting cold.
- Ex8: I'm sorry your mother is ill. I hope she gets better soon.
- Ex9: It was raining very hard. We didn't have an umbrella, so we got very wet.

also get married
get dressed (= put your clothes on)
get lost (= lose your way)

- Ex10: Nicola and Frank are getting married soon.
- Ex11: I got up and got dressed quickly.
- Ex12: We didn't have a map, so we got lost.

Get



GET TO + ĐỊA ĐIỂM

get to a place = arrive:


- Ex13: I usually get to work before 8.30. (= arrive at work)
- Ex14: We left London at 10 o'clock and got to Manchester at 12.45.

get here/there (without to):

Ex15: How did you get here? By bus?

get home (without to):

Ex16: What time did you get home last night?



Get



GET IN / OUT / ON / OFF



- Ex17: Kate got in the car and drove away. (You can also say: Kate got into the car and ...)
- Ex18: A car stopped and a man got out. (but A man got out of the car.)
- Ex19: We got on the bus outside the hotel and got off in Church Street.

get to → Unit 108 in/out/on/off → Units 110, 114 get up → Unit 114 get on → Appendix 6
