

GIỚI THIỆU TRẠNG TỪ



He ate his dinner very quickly.



Suddenly the shelf fell down.

Quickly and suddenly are adverbs.

adjective + -ly —> adverb:

adjective quick bad sudden careful heavy
adverb quickly badly suddenly carefully heavily etc.

Spelling (-> Appendix 5): easy —> easily

heavy —> heavily

SO SÁNH TÍNH TỪ VÀ TRẠNG TỪ

Adverbs tell you how something happens or how somebody does something

- Ex1: The train stopped suddenly.
- Ex2: I opened the door slowly.
- Ex3: Please listen carefully.
- Ex4: I understand you perfectly.

Compare: adjective

- Ex5A: Sue is very quiet.
- Ex6A: Be careful!
- Ex7A: It was a bad game.
- Ex8A: I felt nervous.

(= I was nervous)



It's raining heavily.

adverb

- Ex5B: Sue speaks very quietly. (not speaks very quiet)
- Ex6B: Listen carefully! (not listen careful)
- Ex7B: Our team played badly. (not played bad)
- Ex8B: I waited nervously.



NHỮNG TỪ VỪA LÀ TÍNH TỪ VỪA LÀ TRẠNG TỪ

hard fast late early

These words are adjectives and adverbs:

- Ex9A: Sue's job is very hard.
- Ex10A: Ben is a fast runner.
- Ex11A: The bus was late/early.

- Ex9B: Sue works very hard. (not hardly)
- Ex10B: Ben can run fast.
- Ex11B: I went to bed late/early.

PHÂN BIỆT "GOOD" VÀ "WELL"

good (adjective) —> well (adverb)

- Ex12A: Your English is very good.
- Ex13A: It was a good game.

- Ex12B: You speak English very well. (not very good)
- Ex13B: Our team played well.

But well is also an adjective (= not ill, in good health):

Ex14: 'How are you?' 'I'm very well, thank you. And you?'
