GIỚI THIỆU TỪ "ENOUGH"



She isn't going to take a taxi.
She hasn't got enough money.



He can't reach the shelf.
He isn't tall enough.

Enough

B “ENOUGH” VỚI DANH TỪ

enough + *noun* (**enough money** / **enough people** etc.)

- Ex1: A: Is there **enough milk** in your coffee?
B: Yes, thank you.
- Ex2: We wanted to play football, but we didn't have **enough players**.
- Ex3: Why don't you buy a car? You've got **enough money**. (not money enough)

enough *without a noun*

- Ex4: I've got some money but not **enough** to buy a car
(= I need more money to buy a car)
- Ex5: A: Would you like some more to eat?
B: No, thanks. I've had **enough**.
- Ex6: You're always at home. You don't go out **enough**.

Enough

C “ENOUGH” VỚI TÍNH TỪ

adjective + **enough** (good enough / tall enough etc.)

- Ex7: A: Shall we sit outside?
B: No, it isn't **warm enough**. (not enough warm)
- Ex8: Can you hear the radio? Is it **loud enough** for you?
- Ex9: Don't buy that coat. It's nice, but it isn't **long enough**. (= it's too short)

Remember:

enough + *noun* but *adjective* + **enough**

enough money
enough time
enough people

tall **enough**
good **enough**
old **enough**

D MỘT SỐ CẤU TRÚC VỚI “ENOUGH”

We say :

enough for somebody/something

enough to do something

enough for somebody/something
to do something

- Ex10: This pullover isn't **big enough** for me.
- Ex11: I haven't got **enough money** for a new car.
- Ex12: I haven't got **enough money to buy** a new car.
(not for buy)
- Ex13: Is your English **good enough to have** a conversation?
(not for have)
- Ex14: There aren't **enough chairs for everybody to sit** down.
