because (the reason for something)

sentence A sentence B

Ex12: I opened the window because it was very hot.

Ex13: Joe can't come to the party **because** he's going away.

Ex14: Lisa is hungry because she didn't have breakfast

Because is also possible at the beginning:

■ Ex15: Because it was very hot, I opened the window.

LIÊN TỪ AND, BUT, OR

sentence A			sentence B	
•	Ex1:	We stayed at home	and	(we)* watched television.
	Ex2:	My sister is married	and	(she)* lives in London.
	Ex3:	He doesn't like her,	and	she doesn't like him.
•	Ex4:	I bought a sandwich,	but	I didn't eat it.
	Ex5:	It's a nice house,	but	it doesn't have a garden.
	Ex6:	Do you want to go out,	or	are you too tired?

* It is not necessary to repeat we' and she'.

In lists, we use commas (,). We use and before the last thing:

- Ex7: I got home, had something to eat, sat down in an armchair and fell asleep.
- Ex8: Karen is at work, Sue has gone shopping and Chris is playing football.

We use these words (conjunctions) to join two sentences. They make one longer sentence from two shorter sentences:

sentence A The car stopped The driver got out sentence B

The car stopped and the driver got out.
