Unit 112 – Afraid of ..., good at ... etc. of/at/for etc. (prepositions) + -ing




Afraid of ..., good at ... + V -ing

afraid of / good at... etc (adjective + preposition)







afraid of... / scared of...

angry with somebody angry about something

Ex1: Are you afraid of dogs?

Ex2: Are you angry with me? What have I done?

Ex3: Are you angry about last night?

(= something that happened last night)

EX4: Lisa is very different from (or to) her sister. EX5: I'm fed up with my job. I want to do something different. (= I've had enough of my job) EX6: The room was full of people. EX7: Are you good at maths? EX8: I'm not interested in sport. EX9: Sue is married to a dentist. (= her husband is a dentist) EX10: It was kind of you to help us. Thank you very much. EX11: David is very friendly. He's always very nice to me. EX12: I'm afraid I can't help you. I'm sorry about that. EX13: I'm sorry for/about not phoning you yesterday. (or I'm sorry I didn't phone you) EX14: I feel sorry for them. They are in a very difficult situation

Afraid of ..., good at ... + V -ing

"V-ING" ĐI SAU GIỚI TỪ

After a preposition (of/at/for etc.), a verb ends in -ing:

EX15: I'm not very good at	telling	stories.
EX16: Are you fed up with	doing	the same thing every day?
EX17: I'm sorry for	not phoning	you yesterday.
EX18: Thank you for	helping	me.
EX19: Mark is thinking of	buying	a new car.
EX20: Tom left without	saying	goodbye. (= he didn't say goodbye)
EX21: After	doing	the shopping, they went home.
