Put on your shoes / Put your shoes on

PHRASAL VERB + OBJECT

Sometimes a phrasal verb (**put on / take off** etc.) has an *object* For example:

verb	object
put on	your coat



verb	object
take off	your shoes



You can say:

put on your coat

or **put** your coat **on**

But **it/them** (pronouns) always go before **on/off** etc :

put **it on** (not put on it)

EX1: It was cold, so I **put on** my coat.

or ... I **put** my coat **on**.

EX2: Here's your coat. **Put it on**.

You can say:

take off your shoes

or **take** your shoes **off**

take **them off** (not take off them)

EX3: I'm going to **take off** my shoes.

or ... **take** my shoes **off**.

EX4: Your shoes are dirty. **Take them off**.

Put on your shoes / Put your shoes on

B MỘT SỐ CỤM ĐỘNG TỪ CÓ TỨC TỪ THEO SAU

turn on / turn off (lights, machines, taps etc.):

EX5: It was dark, so I **turned on** the light.
or ... I **turned** the light **on**.

EX6: I don't want to watch this program.
You can **turn it off**.



also switch on / switch off (lights, machines etc.):

EX7: I **switched on** the light and **switched off** the television.

pick up / put down:

EX8: Those are my keys on the floor.
Can you **pick them up** for me?

EX9: I stopped reading and **put** my book **down**.
or ... **put down** my book



Put on your shoes / Put your shoes on

B MỘT SỐ CỤM ĐỘNG TỪ CÓ TỨC TỪ THEO SAU

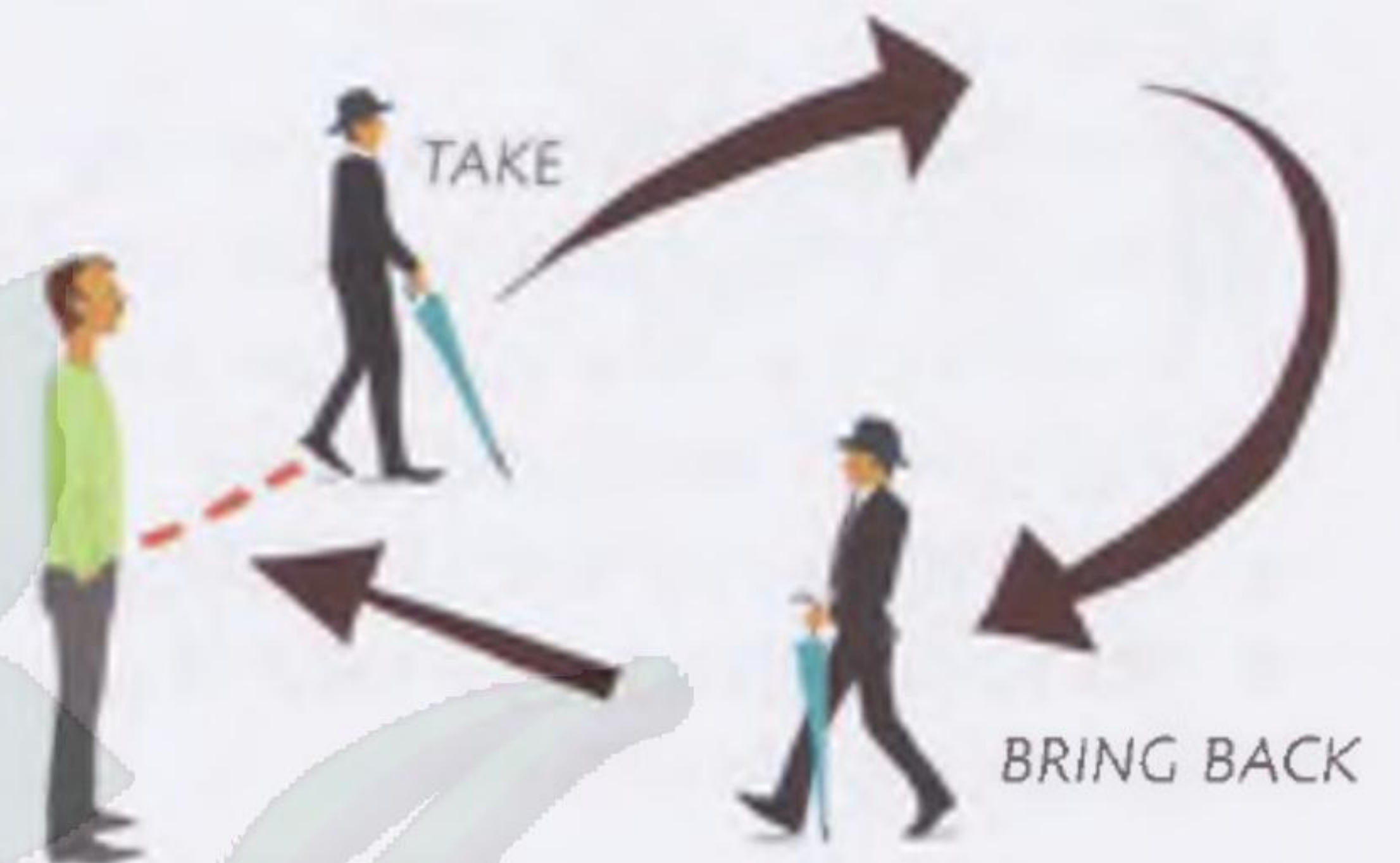
bring back / take back / give back / put back:

EX10: You can take my umbrella, but please **bring it back**.

EX11: I took my new sweater **back** to the shop. It was too small for me.

EX12: I've got Rachel's keys. I have to **give them back** to her.

EX13: I read the letter and then **put it back** in the envelope.
